Teaghan

- BNC- they have not had another community tables
 - Student workers aren't going to be working directly on the decision packages
- Reach out to see if they have any decision packages-email
- Camryn will follow up by this following Wednesday in person
- Athletics- no decision package, come from student feedback
 - May have an increase in student tickets
 - Queue process track student attendance throughout a game

Kaitlyn - outreach, how can we work on student fee transparency?

Noa - Ask Mateo about what they are working on to outreach as well?

Carissa - Budget overview, 34.76% reduction in payroll

- Add funding for a second advisor
 - Administrative tasks

- Presidential budget cut in half from 80,000 to 40,000
- Last year we didn't spend \$500,000 and was sent to the reserve balance
- Decision package - Do we need an additional advisor?
- Would be a salary position and a full FTE employee
- We are hoping to spend the reserves on electric vehicles
 - Within 5 years they will pay for itself
- Raise sustainability index to \$5000 to show ASOSU is committed to sustainability and help fund the council
 - Sustainability index: the senate would vote on the proposals
 - 100,000 in the reserves is dogeared for sustainability
- Dissolve MVG 220 Public Relations and combining it and renaming it Community Engagement
- Safe ride used to pay for night owl service and made them go out of business
 - 50,000 can be used for bike share

What is asosu going to do to help the other units?

Teaghan - Living wage corvallis \$15.70

Shawn - \$16.65 (sounds better), CPI-W can differ significantly from month to month

Camryn - Why cpi-w versus cip-u

Shawn - Better for blue collar work

Kaitlyn - Where is the 127.338 coming from?

Shawn - $15 / (\text{cpi september 2021}) = x / \text{cpi}(\text{september 2023})$

- \$16.82- is what it is projected to be

Kaitlyn - Did the \$15.00 in September 2021 meet the cpi-w threshold?

Shawn - Not entirely sure

Narmeen - Why not go for the \$15.70

Shawn - It doesn't adjust for us being college students. \$16.65 should be enough. It should save you from working less.

Kaitlyn - Is the goal to increase fee-funded workers each year?

Shawn- We don't want to raise the student incidental fee.

Noa - The amount that it went up was less in previous years.

Kaitlyn - The incidental fee always increases from year to year

Camryn - What is your timeline for the student fee increase

Shawn - More or less up to the departments. They are going to have to ask the university for more money and the university will change their funding streams.

Camryn - Average hourly across department is \$15.40

Teaghan - It is not a weighted average. We want to see this actually go into effect.

Kaitlyn - The student fee was raised to reach \$15.00

Narmeen - It would be a \$4.00 increase per student per term

Camryn - Would it be beneficial to reach out

Shawn - How would we be able to hold them accountable?

Kaitlyn - What are we going to say

Shawn - It needs to be timely and efficient

Kaitlyn - Is there a goal for this to increase each year?

Shawn - There is a vague section for this on the resolution.

- Is that not in a way placing admins' needs in the way of the students?

Kaitlyn - Where is there wiggle room for the budget

Shawn - They're going to tell us that it should be less.

Kaitlyn - They could just cast it aside

Shawn - The university will just say that they don't want to pay a living wage. It would be in their best interest.

Teaghan - We want to go to them before by raising tuition. We could disagree that it should be lower. We have approached this before. We are coming to them to see where the money is coming from.

Shawn - This is what we are doing and we want to see where the money is coming from.

Teaghan - It depends on how long it takes to talk to these people.

Shawn - It would go in the financial package for 2025. Wouldn't it be better to create a timeline?

Teaghan - Maybe we should create a timeline to vote on the resolution? We don't have any power over the university.

Shawn - How long are we going to wait for the university?

Teaghan - We should vote on it by the end of winter term.

Hailey - There were some concerns about voting on it too soon.

Eliza - 15.16 average for non-duplicates workers, 15.20 average for duplicate workers

Shawn - It is on the table and they pick up the pieces. It is a difficult conversation to talk to the admin. The incidental fee would be a last cast scenario.

Kaitlyn - The primary thing is reallocation.

Hailey - Would you want an amendment to the resolution to include that you don't want to raise tuition or fee and instead reallocation. Also we want you to elaborate more on the regularly reassessed statement. The senators wanted more clarity.

Shawn - I understand what you are saying.

Noa - What are we bringing to the senate?

Hailey - We are in support of the numbers and figures and also the clarifying.

Teaghan - How can we argue against the 15.70 figure?

Camryn - That doesn't include the cost of tuition.

Kaitlyn - That is based on blue collar workers to be the most accurate to be adjusting for COLA. How do we know that it is enough? Why did they originally choose the 15?

Shawn - The CPI-W is localized for the pacific. That might be more of the 15. I did think why we didn't put the no incidental fee specifically because it looked bad on paper.

Teaghan - Most of the units only get their funds from the student fee and they don't make money so where would they get money from?

Kaitlyn - The fee would be affecting everyone. The university needs to be reallocating money to everyone then if we want to raise fee-funded units without raising the student fee.

Camryn - Why don't we have two different resolutions

Teaghan - Do you think that it is worth putting out a survey for an increase of \$4.00 a term.

Kaitlyn - Tiered approach, to start by funding the people making under certain amounts to a higher amount first.

Matteo - \$15.86 is what fee funded units get paid currently

Kaitlyn - How was the 15 reached?

Matteo - The \$15 was to align with the national movement.

Kaitlyn - Who should we reach out to?

Matteo - Don't reach out to the board of trustees, university budgets committee. We are getting to a one sided view.

Camryn-They should be allowed to have this flexibility during the summer.

Hailey-People should be able to have internships and other jobs.

Kaitlyn-What exactly does the archivist do?

Should we lower it to 10?

Camryn-I would like to keep the records clerk to 24? Maybe we should lower it in the summer?

Hailey-Does the JC chair work 10 hours a week?

Teaghan-I don't think the vice-chair needs to work more hours?

Camryn-Could we raise the hours for just the Winter term?
