Minutes:

An email was received back from Joseph, he plans to reach out again soon in order to set up a time for a campus walk. In the meantime, the committee has decided to continue forward with the drafting of a resolution that would call on the university to do the following:

- Increase campus lighting, with an emphasis on sustainable practices
- Increase student awareness of how to report broken lights, and to make sure that this form is accessible and easy to find

In addition to this piece of legislation, the decision was made to look into submitting a funding proposal for new sustainable lights along SW Washington Ave. This funding proposal would seek to take funds from the ASOSU sustainability fund, and would be ASOSU's "buy in" on the project, alongside facilities. Senator Donahey will speak with President O'Donnell about this idea, and this idea will also be proposed to facilities during the campus walk.

Significant discussion was had at this week's meeting about SR-83.02 and the impacts it is having at the SFC level. All who were present at the meeting agreed that, given the likelihood this topic makes it's way back into the Senate, there should be preliminary discussions that are had in an attempt to form a more unified front when tackling the fee bills in two weeks. Senator Donahey will bring this up at the next Senate meeting on 1/24.
