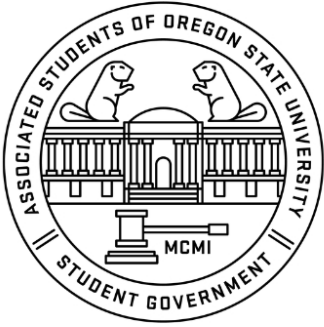

As a transfer Business Administration student at OSU, I've worked along students with many different backgrounds. Maintaining a 4.0 GPA while balancing extracurriculars, leadership roles, and academic workload has sharpened my discipline, time-management, and collaborative decision-making skills. These skills, along with my open-mindedness, professionalism, and attention to detail, position me well to become a Judicial Councilor.

In addition to my academic work, I have sought many opportunities that strengthen my legal skills. Through Mock Trial, I have grown more comfortable with procedural rhetoric, analysis of legal frameworks, and consideration of multiple perspectives. In Forensics Public Speaking and Debate, I have strengthened my public speaking skills, logical reasoning, and quick analytical judgment. As an Ambassador in the Pre-Law Society, I lead LSAT study sessions, demonstrating agency, cooperation, and a commitment to supporting others. Additionally, I've served on the Citizen Review Board in Marion County, a citizen-led volunteer board that reviews foster cases and makes impartial judgments to support the welfare of children. Preparing for CRB meetings required reviewing hundreds of pages of case material, which helped me improve my reading comprehension and analysis of lengthy, technical documents. During the meetings I asked open-ended questions to evaluate the treatment of the foster children and deliberated with a representative board to determine whether treatments were satisfactory. This background mirrors the Council's responsibility to interpret the appropriate documents and reach impartial, fair decisions.

I am confident that my experiences would allow me to contribute meaningfully to the Judicial Council. I look forward to meeting and discussing this possibility further.

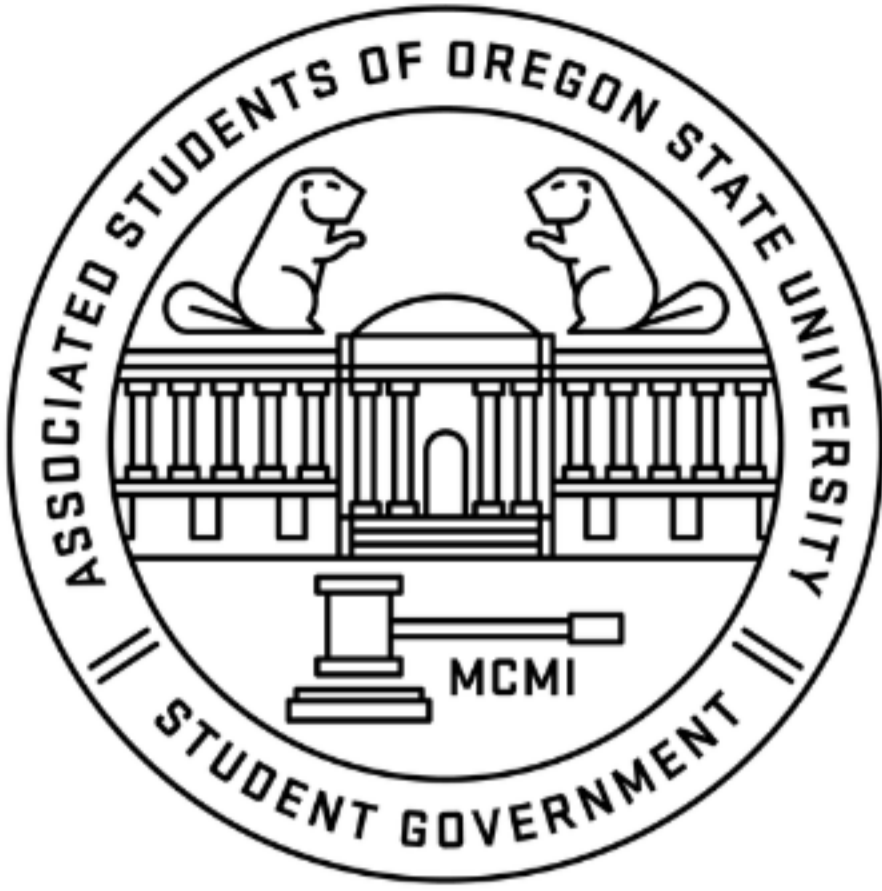
