SB – 85.14

“Design for Social Impact Event and Scholarship Funding”

SUMMARY

Fund Balance request: Minor & Certificate Fair and Creation of Design for Social Impact Scholarship Index

WHEREAS HB 13.18 further specifies that “This Congress shall vote to approve the final allocation for each expense unless it establishes an alternate process for the approval”;

WHEREAS The Senate is the constitutional successor to the former Congress and the current Constitution stipulates that “Approved fee recommendations” as well as “Contracts agreements of a contractual nature, fiduciary debts and memorandums of understanding” from the prior constitution remain in effect;

WHEREAS Design for Social Impact (DSI) is a multidisciplinary OSU microcredential program aiming to teach students “The power of collaboration through multidisciplinary projects and a supportive community, learning to leverage communication skills, holistic problem solving, and human centered design to tackle complex problems effectively.”

WHEREAS DSI seeks to host a Minor & Microcredential fair to promote OSU degree and microcredential programs on April 21st in the SEC, and its facilitators have requested assistance from ASOSU to finance the renting of SEC grounds, providing refreshments, and sourcing promotional materials.

WHEREAS DSI’s facilitators have determined this fair, open to all students, would produce a required cost of \$2,500 to provide education on opportunities available to OSU students to expand their learning and credentials, promoting utilization of OSU programs with financial outreach support from ASOSU.

WHEREAS DSI has identified a primary barrier to addition of the microcredential for students has been the funding of >2 4 credit classes.

WHEREAS DSI's leadership has reached out to ask for assistance in funding a scholarship school to expand access to this microcredential for OSU Students.

BE IT HEREBY ORDERED BY THE ASOSU THAT UPON PASSAGE:

ASOSU will provide DSI with a total of [] allocated from the ASOSU Fund Balance. Including \$2,500 in order to fund the April 21st SEC minor and certificate fair, in addition to allocating [] to establish a DSI Scholarship fund in which applications will be reviewed on the basis of need by DSI leadership.

Scholarship funding proposals:

- a) \$30,000
- b) \$20,000
- c) \$15,000
